<u>DAY: 1</u>

We started our journey on 9th Aug 2018 and our tourism bus started from college campus to Visakhapatnam at night 9.00PM.

DAY 2 (10.08.2019)

Rama Krishna Beach

Swimming, sunbathing and beach volleyball are popular activities on the beach. An aquarium, the Kali temple, Visakha Museum, roadside restaurants offering seafood is other attractions.



DAY 3 (11.08.2019)

On day 3, we started our journey to borra caves from simhachalam at 9.00AM. While travelling to borra caves, we got exited and got enjoyed by seeing the beauty of the hill. We reached borra cave at 12.30 PM.

BORRA CAVES

Borra Caves are located about 90 kms north of Vishakhapatnam in the Ananthagiri Hill Ranges of Eastern Ghats of India. It falls in the State of Andhra Pradesh. William King, the British geologist discovered the cave in 1807. It is a naturally formed cave believed to be 150 million years old. The Humic acid in the water reacts with the Calcium Carbonate in the limestone and dissolves the minerals breaking the rock gradually.

The 300 ft. thick roofed wonder spread over one square km., presents a breath-taking display of natural sculptures of Mother Earth. There are some 400 steps inside to go deeper and more down there.





Around 5PM, we came out of the cave and started our journey to araku. We reached araku around 7.30PM and check-in to a hotel around 8.00PM.

Day 4 (12.08.2019)

On day 4, we started our journey around 9.00AM to enjoy the beauty of araku valley.

AARAKU VALLEY


Araku valley, an amazing hill station, one of unfathomable valley in India lures the tourists with its breathtaking landscapes and pleasant weather. Lush green forest, musical notes of waterfalls makes the journey livelier, located 115 km from Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh and close to Orissa border.



We visits tribal's museum in a aku and spend some valuable time there from 9.15AM to 10.45AM and get know about the culture of the different tribal's who lives in a raku valley.

ARAKU TRIBAL MEUSEUM

We reached to tribal museum at 6:30 PM. The Araku Tribal Museum is perhaps as famed as the place that houses it, the splendiferous Araku Valley. Started in February 1996, the museum unlike others is not historical, but instead showcases the orthodox lifestyle, along with the social, economical and cultural norms and customs of the native tribes of the region. The museum itself is built with mud and various metals that give it an authentic tribal feel and lend more credence to the art facts that reside within.



The second level of the museum also houses a shop with number of artists from local tribes, setting up stalls to try and entice customers with their own skilful creations of tribal art. The museum also houses The Tribal Arts and Craft Centre, which is aimed at promoting and showcasing the hitherto unknown tribal art of the region.

After visiting the tribal museum, we visits nearby coffee museum till 11.00PM and gained some knowledge about the history of coffee. Then, we started from there to visit Chapra Falls and reached that place at 12.00PM.



CHAPARAI WATERFALLS

Chaparai waterfalls are a well-known picnic spot in Araku valley. A scenic place with waterfalls and surrounding forest area makes people relax and spend their holiday joyfully.





We spent a very joyful time in the waterfall till 3.00PM, the after taking lunch we moved back to simhachalam at reached that place at 8PM and check-in to the hotel rooms around 8.15PM.

<u>Kailasagiri</u>

Chilka Lake

Kalijai Temple

Kalijai Temple is located on an island in Chilika Lake. It is considered to be the abode of the Goddess Kalijai. Goddess Kalijai is actually Kali, the source and the first 'Mahavidya' of 'Dasmahavidyas'. Highly revered by the local populace, the deity has been venerated in the local folklores and legends. The island provides an excellent destination for pilgrims as well as tourists.



We took our lunch at 3:00 PM .Then we started our journey to Bhubaneswar and reached there at 7:00PM and checked into Captial O hotel and had dinner at 9:00 PM. We had our breakfast at 8:00 AM and checked out of hotel on 11th Aug at 10:00 AM . Then we visited the city of Bhubaneswar and had our lunch at 1:30 PM and we started our journey to Nandankanan Zoo.

Nandankanan Zoological Park

Nandankanan Zoological Park is a 437-hectare zoo and botanical garden in Bhubaneswar, Odisha, India. Established in 1960, it was opened to the public in 1979 and became the first zoo in India to join World Association of Zoos and Aquariums in 2009.



Then we started our journey to Konark at 6:00 PM and we reached at 9:00 PM. We checked into the Surya Inn hotel. On Aug 12th morning we went to beach at 5:00 AM to witness to the Sunrise.

Konark Beach

Clean sands, turquoise waters, sun, and cool breeze are typical to the Konark Beach, Konark. It is regarded as one of the finest Beaches in Konark and is also popular the world over. It is located at a distance of 3 km from the well-known Sun temple. This famous beach draws lots of tourists every year not only from India but from all over the world.



We returned to hotel from beach and had breakfast at 8:00 AM. We checked out from that hotel at 9:00 AM then we went to Konark Sun temple.

Sunrise temple

Konark Sun Temple is a 13th-century CE sun temple at Konark about 35 kilometres (22 mi) northeast from Puri on the coastline of Odisha, India. The temple is attributed to king Narasimha deva I of the Eastern Ganga Dynasty about 1250 CE. Dedicated to the Hindu sun god Surya, what remains of the temple complex has the appearance of a 100-foot (30 m) high chariot with immense wheels and horses, all carved from stone. Once over 200 feet (61 m) high, much of the temple is now in ruins, in particular the large shikara tower over the sanctuary; at one time this rose much higher than the mandapa that remains. The structures and elements that have survived are famed for their intricate artwork, iconography, and themes, including

erotic kama and mithuna scenes. Also called the Surya Devalaya, it is a classic illustration of the Odisha style of Architecture or Kalinga Architecture .



We started our journey from Konark Sun temple to Puri at 12:00 PM, and we reached our destination around 1:30 PM. We had our lunch at 2:00 in Puri and started to Puri Jagannath temple at 3:00 PM and reached the temple at 3:30 PM.

Shree Jagannath Temple



Araku tribal museum



At a distance of 200 m from Araku Bus Station, Araku Tribal Museum is a wonderful place which explores the tribal culture of Eastern Ghats. It is one of the top tourist places to visit in Araku Valley. The Andhra Pradesh Tourism Development Corporation established this museum in 1996. Araku Valley boasts of 19 tribes that live in the vicinity of the town. The purpose of the museum is to create awareness about tribal culture and lifestyle. Araku Tribal Museum is not a historical place but offers information about the tribes that currently live here. Araku Tribal Museum is spread over two levels, built with mud and real metals to portray tribal life. The museum has been designed to showcase tribal lifestyle in motion, starting with a kitchen that displays utensils made of iron and mud. A series of 10 photographs capturing the wedding ceremony of the tribal is very interesting at the entrance. The passages within the museum that connect various sections are constructed of mud walls adorned with drawings and artwork made by tribals. The most impressive section of the Tribal Museum is the one that exhibits the local tribal Mayur and Dhimsa dance.

The museum consists of several clay monuments that depict their day-to-day activities. Various artifacts of the tribal people are exhibited which includes jewellery, hunting tools and kitchen utensils. The museum is well equipped with sign boards, which provides requisite information to aid the visitors. There is a stall in the museum where handicrafts items of the tribes are sold. To encourage tribal art, the museum also possesses a Tribal Art and Crafts Centre, where workshops and exhibitions are held. After visiting Tribal museum, we went to tribal cottages around 6:00 PM.
